



### **WTS Sharon D. Banks Memorial Undergraduate Scholarship**

WTS fosters the development of women in the transportation field by encouraging bright new professionals to undertake careers in the area of transportation. One way it does this is by awarding the WTS Sharon D. Banks Memorial Scholarship to women pursuing undergraduate studies in transportation or a related field.

The scholarship honors Sharon D. Banks, chief executive officer of AC Transit in Alameda-Contra Costa County, California. As its CEO throughout most of the 1990's, Banks led the agency in a pioneering effort to introduce cultural and organizational changes aimed at motivating the public transit workforce. She was a member of the WTS Advisory Board and received the WTS San Francisco Chapter Woman of the Year and Employer of the Year awards.

The WTS Sharon D. Banks Memorial Undergraduate Scholarship is **\$5,000**.

The minimum criteria for selection are:

- a. GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- b. Currently enrolled in an undergraduate degree program in a transportation-related field, such as transportation engineering, planning, finance, or logistics.
- c. Plans to pursue a career in a transportation-related field.

Applications must be submitted through local WTS chapters as typed documents. Scholarships are competitive and based on the applicant's specific transportation goals, academic record, and transportation-related activities or job skills. National awards will be presented during the upcoming WTS Annual Conference in May, and attendance during the awards ceremony is strongly recommended. Conference registration for scholarship winners is complimentary. Local chapters will assist with arrangements upon selection and may have additional requirements, such as personal interviews or higher GPA. Please contact your local WTS chapter for specifics.

I will begin my first full-time engineering co-op on January 12, 2026. This will be the first of two semester-long co-ops with The Kleinger's Group in West Chester, Ohio. I will be working in the transportation department. My team designs complex roadways, bike facilities, traffic signal systems, performs safety studies, and more.

I have worked at Costco Wholesale since May 2024. My current position is in the clothing department, where I maintain the sales floor and assist members with their shopping needs. I have also held other roles at Costco before transitioning to my current position. Previously, I worked in the merchandise department, where I stocked items in the evenings after the warehouse closed. Prior to that, I was a front-end assistant, which entailed assisting cashiers and members and maintaining the sales floor, amongst other tasks.

While I was completing my first bachelor's degree at The Ohio State University, I worked as a student research assistant in the Experimental Hematology Laboratory. In this role, I planned and performed experiments, created presentations about experimental results and presented them to my lab team, and learned how to maintain professionalism in an academic work environment. My project was focused on investigating a possible treatment for Chronic Lymphocytic Leukemia. After working in the lab for a couple of years, I applied and was selected for a competitive Pelotonia Undergraduate Research Fellowship for the 2020-2021 academic year.

Some of my favorite memories are train rides I've taken. Looking out the train window at the inspiring cityscape of NYC and the rolling hills of the Czech Republic were highlights of my vacations. Settling into a comfortable chair, cracking open a book, listening to the soft thump of the wheels on the track, and striking up conversations with someone new highlight exactly what our transportation experiences should be – opportunities to unwind and recharge. These train rides were catalysts for my interest in transportation engineering and my career goal of making transportation more accessible, reliable, and sustainable.

Imagine a United States in which people living in suburbs can ride their bikes to the nearest bus stop, take an electric-powered bus to the nearest metro station, then ride a high-speed electric metro into the city to get to work. The buses and metros are an integrated system, with designated spots onboard for bikes. Buses and metros follow a precise schedule, and their stations are safe and well-maintained. Algorithms running our traffic signals are continuously improved to ensure the system runs well even during peak transit times. Commutes are safe, affordable, and efficient.

My goal is to turn this vision into a reality for the nearly 300 million people living in metropolitan areas across the U.S. It will be no easy feat, but it is possible with dedicated teams and strong leadership. We need fearless leaders to advocate for sustainable transportation systems in our communities and challenge the auto and oil industries that prefer the status quo. I'm a strong leader and an asset to this mission. I've gained leadership experience as the former president of two student organizations, a teaching assistant, and a peer leader for an undergraduate class. The first way that I plan to use my leadership skills to push our field forward is by starting a transportation engineering-focused student organization at UC.

I'm early in my journey to becoming a transportation engineer, but my path is taking shape. I've completed most of my school's first-year civil engineering curriculum, and I'm beginning a series of two full-time transportation engineering co-ops on January 12th.
