Why did the Municipality prioritize this project over any other the Municipality may be considering?	Completing the Ohio & Erie Canal Towpath Trail in Tuscarawas County is the #1 priority of the Tuscarawas County Trail and Green Space Master Plan. Out of all of our projects, this has the greatest regional/state/local impact and will bring us closer to connecting with Tuscarawas County's two largest population centers (Dover, New Philadelphia).

Project Description This project is an extension of the Ohio & Erie Canal Towpath Trail in Tuscarawas County, Ohio. Building off the prior TAP award (PID#111280), this would develop a 10 ft. wide limestone shared use trail from the Dover Dam south 2 miles to State Route 416. We hope to build off this progress by eventually crossing State Route 416 and making an alignment with the City of Dover. The overall goal of the Towpath Trail is to run 101-miles, connecting from New Philadelphia north to Cleveland through the Ohio & Erie Canalway National Heritage Area. This extension is a part of the Tuscarawas County Trail & Green Space Master Plan (2016) which was developed with over 60 public meetings held throughout the county. In addition, this trail is a part of the Ohio & Erie Canal National Heritage Management Plan and within the Ohio & Erie Canalway National Heritage Area developed under the leadership of the Department of Interior. This plan is also included in the Ohio State Wide Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan. This will also allow bicyclists utilizing the State Bicycle Route a safer off-road alternative from State Route 800.

Project area was has been disturbed/developed in the past (railroad) and recently (underground utilities, USACE access road for Dover Dam rehabilitation). No identified environmental mitigation areas; will acquire necessary permits for development. Project construction limits appear to be within FEMA Zone X and outside of FEMA Zone AE. Also appears to be outside USACE flowage easement elevations. Minimal or no tree removal anticipated, though we will comply with Indiana Bat and other endangered species regulations, etc.

Please provide a detailed description of the recereational purpose of the proposed trail.	This project would develop a two mile crushed limestone shared use path as an extension of the Ohio & Erie Canal Towpath Trail from the Dover Dam to State Route 416. Currently, the developed trail terminates at State Route 800 near the intersection of State Route 212. Upon completion of PID#111280, the developed trail will terminate at the Dover Dam. The overall goal of the Towpath Trail is to run 101-miles connecting communities from New Philadelphia north to Cleveland. Tuscarawas County meets monthly with the Ohio & Erie Canalway Coalition and regularly with the Ohio & Erie Canalway Coalition, the City of Dover, and the City of New Philadelphia towards this objective.

The Towpath Trail is a part of the Buckeye Trail, the North Country Scenic Trail, and provides access to the Tuscarawas River Trail. This trail project also provides integration with Camp Tuscazoar and their network of trails.

This project would provide a safe off-road transportation route for pedestrians, bicyclists, and equestrian users. It serves as an alternative to State Route 800, which has high traffic, speeds, and minimal shoulders.

State Bicycle Route 77, and the RTC Industrial Heartland Cleveland to Pittsburgh trail plan.

Please describe any and all Safety benefits this project will bring to the community

State Route 800 at location 2779 has an AADT of 3034. This project provides an alternative off-road route to State Route 800. This separates traffic types, which increases safety by reducing conflict and congestion. The OSTATS traffic dashboard (2019-2024) along State Route 800 between Zoarville and Dover shows nearly 30 crashes each year, a majority of which are attributable to deer, speed, and age.

Miscellaneous:

Will Right of Way be needed to complete this project (MUST be on existg publiclly-owned property).

The Kimble Company (grantor) and the Tuscarawas County Commissioners & Ohio & Erie Canalway Coalition (grantees) have a multi-year, auto-renewing license agreement to develop an extension of the Ohio & Erie Canal Towpath Trail. No additional right of way needs are anticipated. PID#111280 developed under same license agreement.

Please list all public involvement efforts.

This project is a part of the Tuscarawas County Trail and Green Space Master Plan, which was developed with over 60 public meetings held throughout the county. Efforts to continue the development of the Towpath Trail have involved the Ohio & Erie Canalway Coalition, the City of Dover, the City of New Philadelphia, OMEGA, Rails to Trails (Industrial Heartland Trail Coalition), the Buckeye Trail Association, the Tuscarawas County Convention & Visitors Bureau, ODOT District 11, the United States Army Corps of Engineers Huntington District, MWCD, and Camp Tuscazoar.

How would you develop this project if you only received partial funding.

While we are always exploring additional funding support from other federal, state, and local grant opportunities, if we are awarded partial funding we would reduce the project's scope of work. We are held by the license agreement to develop and maintain this trail and are dedicated to open it for public use.
