MS. MONTOYA: We do have today Cindy, our court reporter. She's going to be taking a transcript of this meeting, so make sure you state your name and company clearly before you start talking which I failed to do already. I'm Katie Montoya with ODOT District 6. This is the pre-bid meeting for Franklin 161-15.80, PID 116322, also Construction Project 23-0321. It is April 25th and about 10:04 a.m.

The goals of this project are to add a lane in each direction on State Route 161 from I-270 to Kitzmiller Road, as well as add a lane on I-270 northbound from State Route 161 to State Route 3 and add a lane on 161 westbound to 270 northbound ramp.

We will be widening the at grade structures on State Route 161 as necessary, upgrading lighting, signs and ITS, and the MOT goal is to maintain traffic as much as possible on the route.

Our limits here you can see again, here's 270 limits around the curve, it's just for northbound. We have this ramp here in the northeast quadrant as well as 161. It's just the CD lanes, not

the main line lanes out to Little Turtle and then Little Turtle out almost to District 5 to Kitzmiller, Blacklick Creek. This project sells May 25th of this year, awards June 5th. We estimate construction to start mid July and end the completed project in August of 2025.

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Here's the information for today's preview meeting. We will post the transcript to Contracts website once it becomes available. For addendum and pre-bids, make sure you're submitting those on the above web form.

One addendum has already been issued that added the waterway permit, some signature sheet for the city signatures. We do have an additional addendum coming up next week that will add some material items back into the mix.

Scope of work, I'm just going to hit the important and maybe slightly odd items in here, not the entire scope of the project. We have cooperation between contractors. There's a lot of work going on in this area right now, normal maintenance work, as well as other work to upgrade the corridor and area for the upcoming development and Intel.

The one that's in direct project limits is the Franklin 62. This is just underneath the

bridge. This is a New Albany local project that's still ongoing, so it will be in close coordination with that project especially.

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There might be some that have come up since we filed the plans, so make sure you're looking at TIMS for other projects in the area. There's detours that may come up south outside the project limits that we didn't see.

This has Proposal 123 which is a lump sum minus incentive, so the goal of this is for September 1st of 2024 to have all traffic in the final configuration on intermediate asphalt with temporary pavement markings and traffic safety items as noted in the description critical work. There will be a lump sum incentive of \$1 million and a disincentive per day of 25,500.

There's another short-term hourly closure, SPN140, I believe. So this is short-term, single lane closure of ramp H which is 161 westbound to southbound for just a short duration of 56 hours with a disincentive of 3,000. Window contract, PN129, there's several different ones of that in the window contract with different disincentives. Make sure you're aware of those.

Another point is the subgrade treatment

alternates. We are aware of the current cement shortage or delivery shortages, so we have two alternates, one with cement stabilization globally, one with just excavation of unsuitable and proof rolling granular material, geotextile fabric and such. The alternative one with cement does still include some undercut locations, but they're specific versus alternative too, so be aware of that when you're bidding.

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There are some City of Columbus specifications. All of the lighting within City of Columbus corporation limits will be City of Columbus specifications. There are some general pavement tree and park notes included in the plan.

There are multiple environmental commitments. One I wanted to highlight here was there's no in-stream work allowed at Big Walnut Creek, Alum Creek, Sugar Run, Rose Run or Blacklick Creek. The waterway permit was issued in the last addendum. This address, I know there's a pre-bid question about the temporary access fill, so this addresses what can and cannot be done at Rocky Fork Creek.

Being aware of the accelerated schedule both in design and construction, we had some advanced

material procurement, fiber, including temporary and permanent and splice enclosures. I believe we have a roll of -- or a spool of fiber and some of the splice enclosures from one of the contracts. We're still waiting on a few others, but those should be coming pretty soon. This did not have luckily as much of a delay as we thought they would.

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Ductal iron pipe, this also includes a appurtenances. The scheduled delivery date, the latest is approximately May of 2024. It's 12 months from when we cut the purchase order which we anticipate doing next week.

The next addenda is going to add some materials back to the plan. The structural steel and the steel pile pipes we were unable to prepurchase, so we'll add those materials back. So the plan notes will change to including the materials. And we're also adding H-piles as an alternate to pipe piles. So hopefully -- There still is a supply issue with pipe piles and you need it for the schedule. H-piles will be an option.

I'm the ODOT Project Manager. My e-mail and phone number is in this presentation which I will also send out to this group as well and it will become part of this transcript. Our ODOT

Construction Project Engineer will be John Kesling.
Our Construction Area Engineer will be Tom Lau.

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There are utilities and utility relocations ongoing with this project. Those are detailed more in the utility note. I don't believe any of them have been completed at this time, but make sure you're coordinating with all these utilities. We have some transmission lines -- overhead transmission lines we don't want to disturb.

I will open it up to any questions. And remember, state your name and company prior to asking any question. That includes anybody online, anybody in the room and every time you speak.

I'll ask the designer, is there anything else you guys wanted to add to that, point out in the plans?

MR. FERTAL: Ken Fertal, HDR Project Manager. Nothing from our standpoint right now.

MR. WOLFE: Katie, this is Scott Wolfe with City of Columbus. Has the CICA agency been determined for this yet?

MS. MONTOYA: CICA, is that construction inspection? Are you asking about the construction inspection?

MR. WOLFE: Yes.
