



Dear Mr. Shaner,

I write as the Vice President of the Area Development Foundation, Inc., Knox County's economic development organization, in strong support of the Village of Fredericktown's pending application to the Ohio Department of Transportation for funding under its Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP).

The Area Development Foundation of Knox County is the central clearinghouse of information and resources for economic development activities. From this vantage point, the Foundation took a lead role in recently completing a Village Strategic Plan in collaboration with Fredericktown. While the plan covers many areas of importance, the plan's success relies on the strategic implementation of efforts to leverage available funds for significant impact.

The safety of pedestrians, especially children, is a top priority when considering how to make the village more walkable. This project extends roughly 1/2 mile of sidewalk on West Sandusky Street across from the Fredericktown Local Schools campus and extends up Bollinger Drive, to the existing sidewalk. This will enable pedestrians to safely travel to and from the school campus by walking on the sidewalk and not on the road or through wet, snow-covered, or muddy lawns in the winter. This improvement will also enable pedestrians of all ages to travel to/from the older residential areas to/from downtown, to/from the local convenience store, and to/from Dollar General in a much safer manner. Overall, this improvement is likely to enable residents to pursue a more active lifestyle, thus improving the quality of life in the Fredericktown Community and supporting the local economy in the process.
