Ohio - Knox County

Knox County Ohio has 45 places on the National Register of Historic Places including 1 place of National significance and 5 places of Statewide significance. Significant places include Kenyon College, East Gambier Street District, East High Street Historic District, Knox County Courthouse and Kokosing House.

Prehistoric cultural affiliation(s) include Adena dating back to 999 BC.

Several famous people are associated with these Knox County historic places including Henry B. Curtis, Bishop Gregory T. Bedell and S.S. Tuttle.

Some of the country's most noteable architects helped create the Knox County places including John Jennings, Frank L. Packard, William Tinsley, Daniel Clark, Wrought Iron Bridge Co., James McKee, Evans & Sons, Daniel McKee, George Marple and John Plimpton. Prominent architectural styles found in Knox Country are Greek Revival, Italianate and Gothic Revival.
